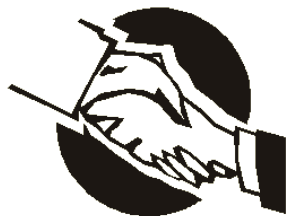

LONG RANGE PLANNING PARISH FACTS

The Long Range Planning Committee wants to keep the parish informed as to the needs of our parish properties—church, school, and other buildings. The areas of need, as our committee sees them, are as follows:

Parish Offices: Our parish offices are currently located in a portion of the old Blessed Sacrament School, over a mile from our school and church. The offices are located on a busy, sometimes dangerous street, and are not handicapped accessible. The building receives no maintenance and working conditions are becoming unacceptable. Our lease situation is very insecure with the possibility of a forced move at any time. We feel that our church office needs to be owned by the parish, must be safe and accessible to all, and be located as near the church and school as possible.

School: The most urgent need at the school, as we see it, is the aging boiler system which is nearing the end of its operational life. The system is very inefficient, resulting in high heating bills and spotty warm and cold areas. In warm weather, the window air conditioning units are aging as well and are an inefficient use of electricity. Repairs to the aging boiler will need to be made soon, and our committee feels that the money would be better spent on a new high efficiency combined heating and air conditioning system.

Meeting Areas: If you have ever tried to schedule committee or group meetings for the church, you know how difficult it can be to find a time when the spaces are not in use. Presently there are over 18 different groups, clubs, committees that are using the meeting areas in church. Some of these are: CRHP meetings for both men and women, several Why Catholic groups, Parish Council, School Board, Scout troops, men's bible study group, RCIA CCW, prayer groups, Fr. George's study group, our church choir practice, the youth praise band. The youth group is currently meeting at the rectory for lack of space to call their own. Funeral dinners are held in St. Michael's Hall when they can be, and Vacation Bible School has had to move to the KC grounds due to scheduling conflicts. This is a wonderful problem to have because it means our parish is vital and growing. However, we need to find additional meeting space to take some of the burden off our meeting areas in church.

Lighting: The lights in church are very inefficient which is resulting in high utility bills. During the "no air conditioning season", the electricity bill for church is twice as high as the one for school. We need to explore the cost of changing our lighting system to high efficiency bulbs.

Rectory: The rectory was built in the 1960's and is in need of upgrading and remodeling..

These are the most pressing needs as we see them and we wanted you to understand why we think this way. In a few weeks, we will be conducting a parish survey to get your opinion on the needs that you see in our parish. Please give this careful thought and if you have any questions or need more information, please contact the parish office, or either the co-chairmen of the Long Range Planning Committee.

Have you asked someone to be a priest or religious today?

Stewardship... *"No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."* **Luke 9:51-62** When Elijah calls to Elisha, he hesitated, "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye." Elijah does not prevent him. Then Elisha kills the team of oxen he was driving, uses the wood of the plow to build a fire to burn their flesh and distributes it to the people and follows Elijah. He detaches himself from everything he previously depended on. Paul tells us, "For freedom Christ set us free." Christ teaches us to be free from attachment to things of this world. This freedom is not for selfish pursuits, but "to serve one another in love." Jesus calls us to follow him, but we sometimes hesitate. If we start to follow Jesus but let other attachments distract us, we will never be free to discern God's will for us and respond in freedom to God for all that he has given to us.
