COVID-19 Protocols and Guidelines Frequently Asked Questions Reference Sheet

- Masks, water bottles, and lanyards must be brought to school each day
- Masks should be worn anytime that students or staff are entering and exiting the buildings, in the hallways, or moving around. When seated at desks and able to maintain social distancing, masks may be removed unless asked by a teacher to wear a mask during class time
- Please self-monitor and check the symptoms chart before coming to school each day
- If your child is not feeling well, please keep them home and monitor them. Please call school to let us know about student absences.
- Students who are sent home from school for not feeling well will need to stay home for 24 hours to monitor symptoms.
- If anyone in an employee's or student's immediate family is being tested for COVID-19, please keep all Holy Family students at home until the test results are returned. If the test comes back negative, then the students may return to school. If the test comes back positive, then the quarantine/isolation protocols will be followed.
- **Positive Test Results** – Employees or students with a positive test results will isolate/quarantine for the number of days directed from local health departments. Upon receiving a positive test result, individuals will receive a release date/return to school/work date from the local health department. The release/return to school date must be provided from the health department for an individual to return to school.
- **Direct Exposure to a COVID-19 Positive Person** – According to Marion County Health Department guidelines, anyone who is a direct exposure to a positive COVID-19 person must quarantine for 14 days from the last known exposure date.
- The travel protocol for Holy Family School is going to be relaxed at this time. It is still strongly recommended that traveling should be avoided whenever possible due to the COVID-19 pandemic and rising cases throughout Missouri and hot spots being located throughout the U.S. and internationally. If a family is planning on traveling, it is encouraged that they contact school administration to discuss travel concerns. It is always our top priority to keep everyone safe and healthy and to be able to remain in school for face-to-face instruction.
